INTRODUCTION

Chris is studying the role of dinosaurs in our culture. Each project in this series approaches this subject from a different angle. *Dinosaur Duo* seeks to find out what we think dinosaurs looked like, how they acted, and why.

Methodology

Chris gave the participants a sheet of paper with the instructions printed on them and a large blank rectangle. The participants were asked to draw any two different dinosaurs interacting in some way. There was an emphasis on the dinosaurs being different species, and that they should actively be doing something together. (These caveats were not always heeded!)

The participants were often children in elementary school in this case, and they used a variety of drawing implements. They usually had 15 to 30 minutes to make their drawings. A high school class and a college lecture class also participated, as well as a variety of individual adults.

Chris collected and/or copied the drawings after they were finished.

Objectives

There were two main goals: to see how people would draw dinosaurs when they didn't have any source material in front of them, and so had to rely purely on their memories and imaginations, and to see what people think dinosaurs might do together.

One hypothesis was that people have only a vague notion of what dinosaurs looked like, past certain major characteristics, like horns and plates. So part of the point was to see

how specifically people might draw the dinosaurs. Another question was how willing they would be to embellish them with imaginary characteristics. *Dinosaur Duo* contrasts with *Skin and Bones I* in that participants in *Skin and Bones I* had a reference to help them draw the dinosaurs, in that they were tracing over the dinosaur's skeleton, and thus were able to focus their drawing on embellishments instead. The question was how that might change if the participants had to draw the dinosaurs from scratch.

Another thing to note was which dinosaurs people chose to draw--would they choose the most obviously popular ones, or something else?

They were asked to draw different dinosaurs to increase the element of contrast, which is always important in any narrative construct.

When it came to interaction, the question was what people might imagine dinosaurs would do together. Would they fight and hunt, as often seen in books and movies, or have other kinds of relationships? Would they be placed in surreal or anthropomorphic contexts? Would people be more willing to let their imaginations run free with dinosaurs than they would with animals that have a more concrete reality in their lives, like deer or tigers?

The following sections of this book provide the original data supplied through the experiment, then analyze that data for answers to the above questions.

The Images

Fowler High School

Administered in a lecture-hall setting to high school students who were in elective art or photography classes. The students used their own drawing implements. They also did other brief, unrelated projects at the same time, with a total of about 15 minutes of time to do any or all of the projects.



Breakdown of the Images' Visual Characteristics

This graphs shows how many drawings of each species can be found in the participants' images.

Generally it lists them by specific dinosaur (Tyrannosaurus, Stegosaurus), but sometimes the drawings are vague, and if so, they are put in the closest category (Other Theropod) or, if they are completely unclear, then they are simply described as "Imaginary/Unclear."



This graphs the percentage of the drawings that had any particular characteristic, as tabulated in the main results chart.

It is simply a bar graph that runs from 0 to 100%. The red line signifies what percent of the total set of drawings had that characteristic.



Analysis of the Images

Comparative Descriptions of Each Group's Drawings

These descriptions tend to discuss the drawings stylistically. The content will be discussed in greater depth afterward.

Fowler High School:

As with all of the projects in this series, the results often tell us about ourselves as much as they do about dinosaurs. What is fascinating about this group's work is how comparatively immature the subject matter is, and how comparatively little effort was expended on it, relative to the other groups, even though most of the other groups are younger. It is also worthwhile to compare them to the work of the college students, who are just a little older. Part of the reason for these results is certainly motivational; the students at this class were excused from their normal classes to attend Chris' presentation, and so had little initiative to be there other than to get out of class. It is also likely not particularly "cool" to be interested in dinosaurs in high school, so a detached, ironic attitude towards the drawings might also be expected.

However, while on the surface it looks like most of these drawings end up as somewhat of a failure--they don't show very well-realized images of the dinosaurs, even though the participants are of an age where this might be expected, and the ways the dinosaurs are interacting are often so anthropomorphized that they are not likely to really be the way the students believed that dinosaurs would interact--they actually succeed very well at their deeper role, which is to act as a mirror or doppelganger for the artists. If someone doesn't care about the subject matter in a particular work, they will just draw it the way they want, and what comes through is a portrait of their own mind and interests. The snappy patter, romance, violence, and barely-sublimated sexuality are all the hallmarks of a standard pent-up high school student's mind. What this series does is to show that these students were

perfectly willing to let dinosaurs act as a stand-in for their own relationships.

Dinosaurs are a somewhat unique target for this kind of projection; currently-existing animals are too concrete to do it fully, and completely imaginary animals like dragons are too abstract. Dinosaurs possess just the right balance of reality and shadow to let them act as frameworks for our imagination. This is a pattern that will hold through the rest of the drawings in the book.

Dewitt Elementary School, 3rd Grade #1:

Among the various elementary school students, it is interesting to see how their general approach to drawing changes from year to year. This project incorporates pre-kindergarten, kindergarten, first grade, second grade, and third grade students, so we are able to see exactly how students' abilities progress over time. It is certainly true that the students' nascent drawing skills hamper our ability to use this project to see what they think dinosaurs really looked like, in the sense that they are not able to accurately render their ideas onto paper by using shade, anatomy, etc. correctly in a technical sense. However, it is once again true that this merely enables us to see what they think is important--characteristics which are clearly more interesting to them than the exact shape of a dinosaur's shoulder or toes!

The dinosaurs this group drew tend to have dinosaur characteristics, but they do not fully cohere into completely-realized dinosaurs. In other words, they will have plates like a stegosaurus, long necks like a sauropod, teeth or claws like a theropod, but their overall body design is somewhat ambiguous and random. This shows that when they are thinking about dinosaurs, they are not thinking about the exact contours of their bodies; they identify them through their special

characteristics, the things that make dinosaurs different from us, and different from other currently-existing animals.

This group of students drew their dinosaurs exuberantly, and made up fun, enjoyable stories.

West Virginia University:

These students put a fair amount of effort into their drawings. It is worthwhile to compare them to the high school students. These students were there of their own free will, and were specifically art students, so using drawing as a method of imaginatively recording information was a more automatic outlet for them. College students are also perhaps somewhat past the more cut-throat social pressure of high school, so they are free to think dinosaurs are fun again.

Their drawings, therefore, create much more involved tapestries of their imaginations, including more-representational dinosaurs, fleshed-out backgrounds, and complex stories. Of course, there are many exceptions as well. The actual subject matter is not radically different from the high school images--sex and violence always lurk around the corner, just as predicted in *Emoticon*--but they are more cleverly woven into the scene here. They are more idiosyncratic.

In terms of drawing the actual dinosaurs' forms, they actually do not always pass the state of the elementary school drawings, in the sense that the dinosaurs possess what are clearly dinosaurian characteristics, but do not always manage to create a persuasive whole. However, generally speaking they are somewhat more specific and holistic in their approach to anatomy.

Erwin Nursery School, Pre-Kindergarten:

This is the youngest age group that did this project, and it

was probably a little beyond their abilities. However, it is still interesting to see what they did with this challenge.

The drawings are fairly abstract, and the figures are rudimentary. The stories are fairly simple and straightforward. However, they possess a kind of purity which makes them revelatory to look at; the dinosaurs' interactions reflect the level of interactions that exist within the students' awareness at this time: looking at things, eating, simply being together. To a child of this age, these kinds of interactions are the vocabulary of their life; a dinosaur can't do anything more than that in their minds, because they are not really aware of other forms of interaction. This kind of "childlike" behavior actually ends up being much more mature than the work by the high school and college students, because they don't have competing levels of reality to assimilate (sincerity vs. irony or self vs. group identity, for instance); they are just at one with their world, in a way that is probably more akin to any animal's experience of reality than the meta-view of a college student.

Redhouse art gallery:

These drawings were by a range of adults and children and show off an accompanying range of drawing skills and motivations. As usual for Chris' project, adults often make the most interesting work, once they can be persuaded that creative activities are not just for kids!

The stories tend to be straightforward, with some unique exceptions.

XL Projects art gallery:

These drawings were made by a similar mix of adults and children, and produced similar results.

Museum of the Earth:

These drawings were all made by children, but of various ages, up through the teen years. It should be noted that these teens' work is comparatively more thorough and exuberant than the high school students' work, which can probably be attributed to the fact that they were at the museum willingly, and chose to do this project from among the various other options at the museum of their own free will.

The drawings range from fairly abstract to fairly representational. The stories also range from very simple to slightly more complex and humorously goofy.

Dewitt Elementary School, 3rd Grade #2:

Generally similar to Dewitt, 3rd Grade #1, except that the dinosaurs tend to be more holistically drawn, and not so much a collection of characteristics. Highly inventive imagery.

Bellevue Elementary School, Say Yes Kindergarten #1:

The imagery is transition from the more abstract forms seen in Erwin Nursery School to a slightly more concrete sense of figure, some with dinosaur characteristics and some without.

The text ranges from non-existent to simple descriptions to semi-stories.

However, they are very creative users of these simple elements, creating fairly fantastic scenes. This is another example of the balancing point between fantasy and reality on which dinosaurs sit. Children of this age have even less knowledge of dinosaurs than adults, so the imagery becomes more about fantasy and the stories are more archetypal.

Bellevue Elementary School, Say Yes 2nd/3rd grade #1:

Fairly close to holistic-looking dinosaurs, but still with an

anthropomorphic/imaginary aspect. They possess many unique details and creative aspects; they were very involved in their drawings. The stories are entertaining and involved.

Bellevue Elementary School, Say Yes 1st grade:

They still live in a world that is partially representational, with clear dinosaur characteristics, and on the other hand it is partially random and imaginary. The stories clearly show a much greater sense of motivation and plot than kindergarten classes.

Dewitt Elementary School, 3rd Grade #3:

The drawings are fairly representational and look like complete dinosaurs. The stories are not as complex as some others of their age group.

Bellevue Elementary School, Say Yes 2nd/3rd grade #2:

The dinosaurs are mostly collections of dinosaur characteristics with semi-random bodies; many look closer to modern animals than those of other groups. The stories are straightforward.

Bellevue Elementary School, Say Yes 3rd grade #1:

These drawings show a lot of detail in things like background and coloration. They have a lot more detail and cohesion in their characteristics and are more persuasively dinosaur-like than most. It is a very egg-centric set of drawings! The stories are straightforward.

Bellevue Elementary School, Say Yes 2nd grade:

These have somewhat more of a range in drawing level than most other groups. Some are fairly abstract while others have reasonably-honed dinosaurian forms. They have a very fun and playful style of drawings.

Bellevue Elementary School, Say Yes Kindergarten #2:

The imagery is pretty abstract but creative. The stories are more complicated than many for this age level.

Bellevue Elementary School, Say Yes 3rd grade #2:

The drawings are still in the form of somewhat random bodies with some dinosaur characteristics, and are simpler than many for this age level. The stories are straightforward.

Ed Smith Elementary, Kindergarten:

Most of these images are closed forms with some dinosaur characteristics, but some are fairly abstract. Others look reasonably persuasive. They are creative and use color nicely. The stories are basic but often creatively anthropomorphic.

Miscellaneous:

The drawings are made with care and attention to detail. The stories are creative and complex. This is one of the more interesting groups due to the self-awareness of the text.

Overview of the Groups of Drawings

The drawings as a whole tend to reflect the age and interests of the artists, both in drawing style and in their characters' stories. The drawings generally don't tend to be particularly realistic, either stylistically or anatomically.

They show the dinosaurs in a series of behaviors that in some cases are probably pretty close to what they think dinosaurs would have acted like (especially in the case of children's drawings), and in other cases are willfully anthropomorphic or fantastic.

Most-Drawn Dinosaurs

The most popularly-drawn dinosaur by far was *Tyrannosaurus rex*, which was featured in almost half the drawings. Interestingly, the second-most popular dinosaur was the

ambiguous category "imaginary/unclear." *Stegosaurus* came next, beating out *Triceratops*; in many of the other projects these two were reversed. It may be that *Stegosaurus*' plates are easier to draw, are more recognizable, or are more uniquely dinosaur-like than *Triceratops*' horns. *Pterodactyl* once again beats out *Pteranodon*. The graph shows the *Long Neck*, *Apatosaurus*, and *Brontosaurus* separately, but if they were combined, they would be the second-most popular dinosaur. *Velociraptor* is reasonably low down the list, once again showing that its *Jurassic Park* popularity hasn't taken a permanent hold, or at least it has only to the degree that it is now recognizably a second-tier dinosaur. *Diplodocus* scored very low; it used to be a very popular dinosaur, but seems to have fallen out of favor these days.

Some fairly obscure dinosaurs, like *Therizinosaurus*, *Kentrosaurus*, *Caudipteryx*, *Dilophosaurus*, *Carnotaurus*, *Psittacosaurus*, *Struthiomimus*, and *Charcarodontosaurus* were drawn for this project, which is all the more impressive considering the participants' average age and the fact that they were not able to do any research on their own, as opposed to *Casting Call*.

Trends in Content

All of the following trends should be understood in the light of the knowledge that a third of the participants completed the project incorrectly by either not writing down their story or by drawing only one dinosaur species instead of two.

Several participants drew on both sides of the paper. Sometimes this was because they were unhappy with the drawing on the front, sometimes they wanted to continue the drawing on the front, and sometimes they were done early and simply wished to doodle. Usually these drawings on the backs of the paper were also dinosaur-related, but not always. The backs

of the paper are always printed alongside their fronts in the images above, but are only listed on the chart if they had to do with dinosaurs.

There was a very low amount of “disreputable behavior” in the images, in the sense of cursing, drinking, or sexuality. The few examples came from the high school and college students.

There was a small trend towards having dinosaurs eating the wrong kind of food--plant eaters eating meat, meat eaters eating plants. It was never clear whether this was intentional.

A fairly high number of dinosaurs either possessed human objects or were in anthropomorphic situations--almost a third of the drawings altogether.

Several dinosaurs spoke to each other as if they were human (“Hi, how’s it going?”), while others spoke “dinosaur” (“Graaakk!”).

Most of them were at least generally anatomically correct (57%). This means that they had the right number of limbs, the characteristics specific to their species (e.g., Triceratops had horns), and were at least close to the dinosaurs’ basic body contour.

Almost two-thirds had some kind of background imagery, showing that they were invested in creating a whole world for these dinosaurs and not just showing them in some abstract, removed manner.

There was a minor but noticeable trend towards showing some kind of extinction event, or at least referencing the earth’s early geologic state through meteors and volcanoes.

A fairly high portion (17%) involved eggs or mothering in some way; this is likely influenced by the talks Chris would give to the students ahead of time, during which he would mention that some dinosaurs seem to have been good parents, and that others would try to eat their eggs.

One of the major questions Chris had at the outset was whether the dinosaurs in the drawings would all end up fighting or eating each other. These are certainly very prevalent story lines in both the entertainment and scientific media, so it would not be surprising if this was the case. However, aggressive and friendly behavior was split almost exactly, with 41% of the drawings showing aggressive characteristics and 40% showing friendly characteristics.

6% of those friendly dinosaurs explored additional romantic territory, while 55% of the total were involved in eating somehow. (This did not necessarily involve aggression since they may have been eating plants.)

The age of the participants didn’t seem to make a big difference in regard to any of these thematic trends. Young and old alike were willing to have dinosaurs eat each other, or just go for a picnic together holding hands.

Overview

This series implicitly shows that dinosaurs are a fruitful source of imagination and content for people of all ages. They can be simple and complex, peaceful or warlike, and even sexual. It seems like people are able to imagine a wide range of relationships between dinosaurs and they can skip back and forth between “probability” and “fantasy” easily and without worry--in fact, that is almost the point of why people like to draw dinosaurs in the first place.
