KEY:

A number affixed after a president's name indicates which of a president's terms is referred to (i.e., "Cleveland 2" refers to the election that led to Cleveland's second term).

A letter affixed after a term number indicates the place of that third-party contender in relation to other third-party contenders during that particular election (i.e., "Van Buren d" means that the candidate was the third-party candidate with the fourth-highest percentage of states to run against Van Buren for what would become his first term).
